I am writing about a concern that has surfaced within the church. Most recently, someone was in the building near our Sunday School children with the distinctive smell of marijuana on them. In addition, there have also been people who have been here on Sunday mornings with the distinctive smell of alcohol on them. There is no evidence that someone was drinking or using marijuana in the building, however they have come in contact with our young people and other adults which has been disconcerting.

As a church that welcomes all people and all means all, we care about each other and everyone including those struggling with addictions and/or in recovery. We are here also to help and support those who are in need of changes in their lives. Though marijuana is now legal in New Jersey, as is alcohol, it is well known that the smell of marijuana or alcohol can be a trigger for others preventing them from experiencing the church as a safe place. As the apostle Paul reminds us, we must take care not to let our liberties become a stumbling block for others. (see 1 Corinthians 8:9)

As your pastor, I am asking everyone to remember that welcoming all people requires thinking about the needs of others and acting accordingly. While each individual can make their own choices about the use of alcohol or cannabis products, please remember that what one person has been doing prior to coming together may be harmful to another. While all are welcome, not all behaviors build up the body of Christ and we must work together to lift up each other. I pray the choice of each person in this congregation will be to pray for the health and well-being of all persons as we safeguard one another and support one another on the pathway to wholeness.

Should you have any questions, I would be glad to talk with you privately to address these concerns. My hope is that we can continue to bless all people as beloved children of God.
